This training will make the officer aware of potential liabilities that may occur when suicides are successful in a facility. <p><b>DRY FIRE PERFORMANCE- (4 hrs.) (TCOLE 2055)</b>                      This course was developed to improve skills and become more consistent while performing basic firearm manipulations. This course will aid the student in understanding the importance of dry fire in relation to live fire shooting. This course will highlight how a student must dry fire most effectively to become more efficient. 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<p><b>FIREARMS INSTRUCTOR COURSE (40 hrs) (TCOLE 2222)</b>                      This course is required to obtain Firearms Instructor Proficiency Certification from TCOLE. The student will be required to shoot two courses of fire (pistol/shotgun) on the first day with a minimum of 90% (2 attempts). If the student is unable to achieve 90% then they will not be allowed to participate in the course at this time. A comprehensive examination must be given, it will be supplemented by a skills proficiency demonstration. #### **\*\*Physical Fitness Requirement\*\***

Some courses offered by the El Paso County Sheriff's Office Region VIII Training Academy will require a degree of physical fitness.

**Minimum Level-** This level will consist of walking, stepping, and very light cardiovascular exercise.

**Medium Level-** This level will consist of jogging; minimal levels of calisthenics (i.e. push-ups, sit-ups, side straddle hop); and/or beginning levels of hands on contact (i.e. PPCT and O.C.).

**Maximum Level-** This level will consist of running; sprinting; advanced calisthenics; and/or advanced levels of hands on contact (i.e. mobile field force, physical fitness exams).

**Medium and maximum-** These levels will require a blood pressure screening and students who do not pass will not be allowed to participate without a doctor's release on file.
